

MISS RODEO OKLAHOMA CONTRACT

I, _____, THE UNDERSIGNED and designated “Miss Rodeo Oklahoma 20__,” make the following statements and representations to and agreements with the Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Scholarship Pageant and the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. as of the date first written below (“Effective Date”).

1. I am a natural-born female citizen of the United States of America and reside in _____, County of _____, State of Oklahoma.
2. I am a graduate of high school and will produce my diploma as proof thereof upon request. (Or I am presently attending high school.)
3. I have never been married, had a marriage annulled, had a child, nor am I now pregnant.
4. I was between the ages of 19 and 24 as of November 1, 2024. *(Per Miss Rodeo America eligibility, contestant will be 21 years of age by November 1, 2026 and will be no older than 26 years of age by December 31, 2026. Upon request, contestant can provide a copy of government issued identification such as birth certificate, drivers license, passport, etc to verify age.)*
5. I am of good moral character and have never been convicted of any crime.
6. I have not heretofore authorized any person, firm or corporation to use my name, photograph, picture, present or future title in connection with any endorsement or advertisement or any commercial product or service; and I am not under any contract or other obligation to any person, firm or corporation or have any legal obligation which would prevent my participation in an appearance at the Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Scholarship Pageant or the Miss Rodeo America Pageant, or which would prevent or hinder my compliance with the terms, conditions and obligations hereafter specified.
7. I warrant that all of the above statements and representations made herein by me are true and correct.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN AND FOR THE CONSIDERATION of my being designated “Miss Rodeo Oklahoma” and for other good and valuable consideration, I hereby agree to the terms and conditions of the Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Contract (“Contract”) as follows:

1. During my term as “Miss Rodeo Oklahoma,” the length of which term shall be from January 1st to December 31st, I shall not become a contestant or participant in any other beauty or talent pageant or contest or make or agree to any public appearance of any kind without the express permission of the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. which permissions

shall not be granted in any case where my participation in such event would be in violation of the rules and regulations of the Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Scholarship Pageant or the Miss Rodeo America Pageant.

2. I agree that during my term as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma," I shall conduct myself in a manner which shall uphold and maintain the dignity and the honor of that title and position. I further agree that during my term as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma," I shall not become engaged, married or pregnant.
3. I understand that scholarships may be administered and awarded by the Scholarship Committee of the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc., at the end of my reign. I agree to accept and abide by the terms thereof if such award be made to me. I also understand that the Scholarship, if awarded to me, must be used within 12 (twelve) months after completion of my reign as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma" or "Miss Rodeo America" and can only be applied to an accredited educational or vocational program or a current student loan.
4. I hereby designate and appoint the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. as my sole and exclusive representative and agent for making press releases, statements to the news media, contracts, engagements and appearances during my term as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma." I agree to make myself available for such appearances, interviews, filming, tapings, photographic and recording sessions and such other events as are determined by the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. In addition, I authorize the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. to collect for and on my behalf all compensation if due me by reason of the foregoing and upon collection thereof, to pay the same to me; provided, however, that nothing herein contained is intended or shall be construed as any guaranty by the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. of any contracts, engagements or appearances for the same, but is intended solely to attempt to protect the honor and dignity of the title and office of "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma" and my personal participation and interest therein.
5. I agree that the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. may (but shall not be required to) designate my chaperone and traveling companion while I am engaged in activities related to my participation in events as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma."
6. It is expressly understood and agreed that in the event I do not comply with the terms and conditions of this Contract, the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. has the absolute right to request that I resign the title and office of "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma" in which event I shall immediately resign as and forfeit the right to said title and office. In addition, upon my resignation, I shall forfeit and/or return to the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. all awards and prizes to which I would otherwise be entitled within 30 days or pay the face

value as determined by the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc.

7. In the event of my resignation, whether voluntary or upon request of the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc., I recognize the right of the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. to select my successor and such person so selected shall be entitled to receive such prizes and awards as may be determined by the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc.
8. Should I be relieved of my title or resign during my reign, I will be ineligible to compete for any future Miss Rodeo Oklahoma competitions or gain membership with the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. The Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. reserves the right to void the membership of family members or relatives subsequent to the dismissal of title and reserves the right to refuse future membership.
9. I agree that as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma," I will dress appropriately, in western attire, complete with clean crown and banner, to any and all appearances and functions representative of "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma" and be perfectly groomed at all times including the time I travel to and from such appearances and functions.
10. I acknowledge and agree to abide by the standards of conduct set forth in the Titleholder Handbook, given to me on the Effective Date below.
11. I further agree that this Contract along with the Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Scholarship Pageant Rulebook and Titleholder Handbook, copies of which I acknowledge have been received by me, along with other official written directives, amendments, addendums, agreements, communications and notices from the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. and its directors, officers, employees and agents thereto, are incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein and shall continue to regulate the rights, obligations, duties and responsibilities of the title and office of "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma" during the term of my reign.
12. In the event of any occurrence or situation arising from or related to any personal act that I perform during my term as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma" whether specifically covered by this Contract or not and which, in the opinion of the directors and officers of the Rodeo Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc., jeopardize or threaten the reputation of public standing of the title and office of "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma," the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc., Board of Directors may take whatever action they, in their sole discretion, deem appropriate, including but not limited to the remedies herein above specified.
13. I understand that I shall be solely responsible for my personal property and physical well-

being; and that I shall neither ask for, expect, nor receive compensation or reimbursement from the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc., Board of Directors, employees or agents,

for any injury or loss sustained by me as a result of participating in the Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Scholarship Pageant or any activity under this Contract.

14. The Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Crown and the Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Lady-In-Waiting Crown are the possessions of the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. made available to "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma" and "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Lady-In-Waiting" for use during their reign. This Contract explicitly holds "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma" and "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Lady-In-Waiting" liable for, but not limited to, the maintenance, damage, loss or theft of said Crowns. The estimated value of the Miss Rodeo Oklahoma crown is Eight Thousand Five Hundred and Seventy-five Dollars (\$8,575.00) and the Lady-In-Waiting crown estimated valued is Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).
15. I agree to indemnify, save and hold harmless the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc., its Board of Directors, employees and agents for and from all liabilities, obligations, losses, claims, lawsuits, damages, injuries, costs, expenses, and other detriments whatsoever, including without limitation, all consequential damages and attorney's fees, arising out of, or incident to, acts, omissions, conduct or performance under this Contract during the term as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma." Moreover, the indemnities and assumptions of liabilities and obligations, herein provided for, shall continue in full force and effect, notwithstanding the expirations or termination of the Contract term.
16. I also understand that the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. is in no way responsible for my traveling expenses to and from said appearances, except when a fee has been agreed upon between the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. and said scheduled event; however, I understand that the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council Inc. will try to agree upon expenses for said event and reimburse me for said expenses.
17. I also understand that as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma," I will be required to travel to events as determined by the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. on behalf of the Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Scholarship Pageant during my term as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma."
18. I understand that if I should receive the use of an automobile, pickup or trailer for my term as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma" that I will solely be responsible for the insurance covering those vehicles for said term and provide proof of the same.
19. I also agree that I will attend all functions and be present all days and nights during the Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Scholarship Pageant, Coronation and scheduled events. Under no

circumstances will I miss these events.

20. During my reign as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma," it is understood that I will reside in the State of Oklahoma.
21. During my reign as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma," I understand that I cannot co-habitat with anyone of the opposite sex other than an immediate family member.
22. I also agree that during my year of reign, until the day I give up said title of "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma," that I will not wear another crown, buckle or give any representation of any other title but that of "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma," to do so would be a breach of this Contract with the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc.
23. I will designate a charitable organization that I will spend a minimum 15 hours of volunteer time during my reign. If I would like, the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc. can recommend a charitable organization. I will have the charitable organization approved by the board and my hours recorded and reported to my National Director.
24. I will fulfill any and all Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council, Inc.'s sponsor obligations as required, requested or directed.
25. I understand that with reasonable notice thereof, this Contract may be modified or amended by a written instrument signed by all parties. Moreover, I understand that the Titleholder Handbook and Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Scholarship Pageant Rulebook may be modified or amended with or without prior notice pursuant to the sole discretion of the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageant Council, Inc. and that I will be reasonably notified of any such changes therein made immediately applicable to my term as "Miss Rodeo Oklahoma."
26. I agree that any waiver or failure of the parties to exercise in any respect any right provided for herein shall not be deemed a waiver of that right and shall not prevent any party from enforcing that right at a later time.
27. I agree to timely execute such other and further documents as required or requested that may be reasonably necessary to effectuate this Contract, including but not limited to modification and/or amendments thereto.
28. I understand and agree that in the event of any action or proceeding to enforce any of the provisions herein contained by either party hereto against the other, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover its attorney's fees and court costs reasonably incurred in connection therewith from the other party.
29. I understand and agree that this Contract and performance hereunder shall be governed by

the laws of the United States and the State of Oklahoma, and I consent to the jurisdiction
and

venue of the state and federal courts located in Oklahoma for any matter arising out of or enforcement of this agreement.

30. I acknowledge that I have both read and understood the terms of the Contract and after time to reflect and seek counsel thereon, if desired, I hereby agree to be bound by its terms.
31. When making an appearance on horseback (with the exception of a provided horse situation), you must ride in your Miss Rodeo Oklahoma saddle.
32. Titleholders will receive funding toward their personal chaps. Miss will receive \$1,000, and the Teen and Princess will receive \$500. To receive funding, titleholder must submit an invoice from the chap maker. In the instance that a titleholder has received donated chaps, she may present proof of chap donation AND an invoice for an alternative titleholder expense to be approved for specified amount and reimbursed at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

SOCIAL MEDIA AGREEMENT

Serving as Miss Rodeo Oklahoma (MRO), Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Teen (MROT), and Miss Rodeo Oklahoma Princess (MROP) is a privilege, as is representing the Oklahoma Rodeo Pageants Council (ORPC). The organization strives to present a professional image and to use contemporary methods of promotion, including social media. Positive social media impressions help promote the titleholder and the organization, provide exposure for supporters and ensure a future for the organization.

Social media marketing is rapidly changing. The ORPC organization will attempt to stay abreast of best practices and to provide opportunities for titleholders. The following is a guide to be used in setting expectations for titleholders and their family representatives. The ORPC Board has the latitude to modify all related policies at any time. Failure to adhere to these guidelines may result in disciplinary actions.

- 1) MRO will receive administrative access to the Facebook page and Instagram page labeled for her title and will be expected to uphold professional conduct and messaging in all posts. This page is passed from one MRO to the next to build upon followers. She may also have permission to do other outlets but is required to declare those to the National Director and set up the outlet with direction from the social media coordinator. If a new outlet is created and utilized as a MRO page it will then become an account that is passed from one MRO to the next. Login email and password will be created and maintained by the social media coordinator and ORPC Board only.
- 2) MRO is required to participate in ORPC sponsor posts within the guidelines outlined here:
 - a. At least one platinum sponsor post per month on all MRO social media accounts, covering all ORPC Platinum sponsors at least once throughout her reign.

- b. Post is sent to social media coordinator for approval prior to posting – response from coordinator will be within 24 hours unless otherwise notified
 - c. Posts to be of good taste and professional
 - d. Posts are to highlight the sponsor, not self
- 3) MROT will have a Facebook and Instagram page labeled for her title but administrated through the ORPC social media coordinator. This page is passed from one MROT to the next to build upon followers. She will have the opportunity and responsibility to provide quality photos and content to promote her reign, including appearances, sponsors, platform and community service. The social media coordinator may omit any post or part of a post and messaging made. The social media coordinator has the right to edit grammar, spelling or punctuation. Please keep in mind any content created is not only a direct reflection of yourself, but also the ORPC. Please utilize resources available for formatting and appropriate spelling and grammar usage and avoid slang and jargon. Reach out to the social media coordinator with questions or if you need assistance, she is happy to help. The goal is for the titleholder – not her parents – to provide all content and communication to the social media coordinator/team as part of valuable training for the young woman’s personal and professional development.
- 4) MROT is allowed to maintain personal social media accounts under strict restrictions outlined here. If these restrictions are not met and held, disciplinary action will be taken and will result in the titleholder having to de-active personal account for the entirety of her rein.
- a. Profile photo must be in hat and crown, official rodeo dress for the entirety of her rein, Jan 1-Dec 31. If LIW chooses to change personal profile photo. during LIW period, must be in LIW crown and banner – DO NOT use a photo with official crown and MROT banner until Jan 1 of reigning year.
 - b. No personal social media posts or shares to be done with the only exception of those from the ORPC/MRO/MROT/MROP official pages.
 - c. Titleholders are welcome to comment, like and engage on social media while maintaining professional and appropriate content.
 - d. Social media accounts are to remain under the strictest security and privacy settings. Titleholder required to meet with social media coordinator by August 1, or otherwise specified to ensure these settings are correct, and the social media coordinator has the right to remove previous posts that are unacceptable of a titleholder. These settings must remain until AFTER the completion of or resignation of reign.
 - e. Tagged posts or photos must not automatically appear to profile, they must be approved by titleholder. This is a setting on social media accounts.
- 5) MROP will have a Facebook and Instagram page labeled for her title but administrated through the ORPC social media coordinator. This page is passed from one MROP to the next to build upon followers. She will have the opportunity and responsibility to provide quality photos and content to promote her reign, including appearances, sponsors, platform and community service. The social media coordinator may omit any post or part of a post and messaging made. The social media coordinator has the right to edit grammar, spelling or punctuation. Please keep in mind any content created is not only a direct reflection of

yourself, but also the ORPC. Please utilize resources available for formatting and appropriate spelling and grammar usage and avoid slang and jargon. Reach out to the social media coordinator with questions or if you need assistance, she is happy to help. The goal is for the titleholder, with guidance of a parent, to provide all content and communication to the social media coordinator as part of valuable training for the young woman's personal and professional development. Parents are to be copied in all communication with the titleholder and social media coordinator, but the communication is suggested to come from the titleholder herself.

- 6) MROP is not permitted to maintain a personal social media presence. All social media accounts must be deactivated on or before Dec 31 prior to beginning of reining year and must remain deactivated until completion or termination of reining year. Failure to comply with this guideline will result in disciplinary action.
- 7) The OPRC program is what provides opportunities to all titleholders and requests that they become the primary outlet for titleholders' social media presence. Parents and other family members are then encouraged to share from the official posts from titleholder or ORPC pages.
- 8) **The ORPC will announce the winners of the pageant. The titleholders and parents are encouraged to share these posts. The first 24 hours after the pageant, newly crowned titleholders and parents are required to share ONLY posts from the ORPC accounts on social media. After the first 24 hours, parents and newly crowned titleholders are welcome to create their own social media posts following the guidelines outlined in this document.**
- 9) During the Lady-In-Waiting (LIW) period, representatives can maintain their personal social media accounts. However, they should note they are already representing the OPRC and will be viewed by others as royalty. Posts should be in good taste, and care should be taken with all posts, photos, shares, comments and likes. Disparaging remarks about the pageant or others should not be made by LIW or her immediate family. If there are issues or concerns, those are to be brought directly to the ORPC Pageant Director or President immediately.
- 10) The OPRC social media coordinator/team will transition pages from current to new titleholder around January 1 of reining year, not before and no later than January 3 of reigning year. This timeline may be adjusted to allow for promotion of the Miss Rodeo America Pageant, coronation fundraisers, etc. communication and coordination with the coordinator is crucial and is the responsibility of titleholders and LIWs.
- 11) LIW and titleholders who ignore or circumvent to requirements outlined in this document will be notified by the National Director or OPRC Board President with directives to correct the behavior.
- 12) MRO LIW will have monitored access to the MRO pages during the week of the Miss Rodeo America Pageant. This access is strictly to share updates and document her experience as LIW

during the week. The focus of this time is to highlight the current MRO competing at the Miss Rodeo America Pageant. NO photos of pageant events are to be taken or shared, as there is an official pageant photographer. Sharing posts from Miss Rodeo America, Miss Rodeo America Scholarship foundation, and the official Miss Rodeo America photographer are acceptable. 24 hours after the Miss Rodeo America Coronation, all page access will be removed until Jan 1 of reining year. Failure to comply with these guidelines will result in disciplinary action. Please contact the social media coordinator with assistance or any questions.

13) All photos in crown and banner taken at coronation or any official photoshoot during the LIW period are NOT to be posted by titleholder or parents on social media until Jan 1 of reining year. Photos in LIW crown and banner are welcomed. The current titleholder deserves to be respected as the sole titleholder for her year in this capacity and to prevent public confusion.

14) If a titleholder is under any disciplinary restrictions during her reign, limitations also may extend to her social media presence. Posts may be delayed, curtailed or stopped until deemed appropriate.

15) If a titleholder, or her parents, has any questions about social media, they should first contact the social media coordinator. The National Director may be included in this communication. If the titleholder or her parents feel that the social media coordinator is not receptive or responsive, they may contact the National Director privately.
